Let's keep turning good intentions into great results – side by side.









From rising temperatures to record-breaking deforestation, recent reports by the UN and IPCC warn of accelerating climate shifts. GREEN GUARDIAN PROMINENT PERSON INTERVIEWED BY MR. NARA SUBRAMANIAM

I had the honour of meeting Mr. Ajay Kumar Singh to exchange ideas on education, empowerment, and sustainability. In my opinion, his work in these areas is truly inspiring, and I feel his journey offers lessons for all of us.

Nara: Mr. Ajay, your experience in sustainability, ecological conservation, and urbanisation is remarkable. How do you see the connection between them?

Mr. Ajay: I think ecological conservation and urbanisation are deeply connected. Growing up in a busy city, I saw first-hand the damage rapid urbanisation can cause—but I also realised the potential for sustainable solutions. During my college days, I joined a local urban gardening project, turning abandoned lots into green spaces. My opinion is that integrating green infrastructure into city planning is essential for both nature and people.

Q1. How can schools drive sustainability and the SDGs?

In my view, schools can build awareness about sustainability principles, integrate them into lessons, inspire responsible, global citizens, and empower students to tackle socio-environmental challenges. This will encourage lifelong learning and action.

Q2. You've trained over 700 leaders—how do you bring sustainability into leadership?

I try to design courses with sustainability at their core. This involves real-world examples, encouraging eco-friendly strategies, continually fostering a culture of stewardship and making learning experiential.

Q3. As a Green Ambassador at EDUFAM, what projects stand out for you?

I'm proud of a number of projects that we implemented:

- Waste management and recycling programs.
- Energy efficiency and renewable energy adoption.
- Creating eco-clubs and green teams.
- Organising climate change campaigns.
- Tree planting and biodiversity work.

Q4. How do you ensure rural communities are included in SDG awareness?

In my opinion, inclusion means taking workshops to rural areas, using digital platforms to share knowledge, partnering with local organisations as much as possible, creating materials relevant to local contexts and ultimately empowering local leaders.

Q5. What role should educators play in climate literacy?

In my opinion, principals and teachers should embed climate literacy into lessons, promote eco-friendly habits in schools, encourage critical thinking on environmental issues and finally they all must lead by example.

Q6. Can you share a student-led success story?

I feel proud of a recycling project that cut school waste by 30%. Students organised drives, launched awareness campaigns, and began composting. It was recognised regionally and inspired other schools, showing me that when students take ownership, real change happens.

Nara: Thank you, Mr. Ajay. I think your work in education and sustainability is invaluable. Congratulations on being named one of Bihar's most influential leaders.

- Carry a reusable water bottle and shopping bag.
- Say no to single-use plastics (e.g., straws, cutlery, cups).
- Switch off lights, fans, and appliances when not in use.
- Use public transport, carpool, or cycle when possible.
- Compost kitchen waste to reduce landfill burden.
- Support local farmers and shop at eco-conscious markets.



☀️ SEASONAL TIPS

- **Summer:** Air-dry clothes, use fans instead of AC, hydrate naturally.
- **Monsoon:** Collect rainwater, grow indoor plants or herbs.
- **Winter:** Layer clothing instead of turning up the heater.
- **Autumn:** Plant native trees, declutter and donate or recycle items.
- Adjust your diet seasonally using fresh, local produce.
- Repair seasonal items (like umbrellas) instead of replacing them.

HOT TOPICS IN CLIMATE ACTION

June–July 2025: A Stark Reminder of Escalating Climate Extremes

June 2025 brought alarming global climate anomalies, with widespread temperature spikes and extreme rainfall events. Land and ocean surfaces worldwide stayed well above average, continuing the year's warming trend. The Arctic, northern North America, central and western Asia, and parts of Antarctica recorded temperature anomalies over 1.5°C above normal. Western Europe, the British Isles, Asia, Australia, and parts of the Pacific and Indian Oceans saw their hottest January–June on record.

Extreme precipitation added to the crisis. On June 10, a rare cold front dumped over 9 inches of rain in 24 hours on South Africa's Eastern Cape, causing deadly floods in Mthatha. From June 10–16, Indonesia faced floods that destroyed thousands of homes and farmland. Tropical Storm Wutip, though initially offshore, inundated Vietnam and southern China, while monsoon rains worsened flooding across southern China.

In the Americas, Hurricane Erick made an unusually early Category 3 landfall in Mexico on June 19. Brazil and Venezuela were also hit by major floods, displacing thousands and damaging infrastructure.


